Friday will kick off with a bus tour of the Braddock Road to the Emanuel Episcopal Church (the remains of Fort Cumberland) in Cumberland, Frostburg University (Lacock collection), Big Savage Mountain & Fort Necessity to see the new diorama of Jumonville Glenn. Friday evening will feature Braddock scholar Dr. David Preston, with a program based on his new book "Braddock's Defeat: The Battle of the Monongahela and the Road to Revolution (Oxford University Press, August 2015). Sessions will continue all day Saturday on the historic Jumonville campus. Refreshments will be served both days, with an optional lunch available with registration.
