

A Stellar Cast for the 2006 Seminar

The 18th annual French and Indian War Seminar is presenting a diverse and exciting program at Jumonville on Friday and Saturday November 3 and 4. This is the fourth in a series of 250th anniversaries of important historical events. First, it was George Washington's first mission to Fort LeBoeuf (2003), then Fort Necessity (2004) and Braddock's Defeat (2005). The 2006 Braddock

Road Preservation Association seminar commences with the customary Friday evening reception at Wesley Hall from 7–9. The speakers and several vendors will be present, and light food and beverages will be served. This is your chance to meet French and Indian War scholars and enthusiasts, and beat everyone else to the best books and other rare materials offered by dealers. The highlight of Friday's session will be a look back at Benjamin Franklin on another important anniversary—the 300th anniversary of his 1706 birth.

Lady Joan Reid, historian of the Benjamin Franklin House in London, will "cross the pond" to address the seminar about Franklin's role as colonial agent for Pennsylvania, and about the Benjamin Franklin House, which opened earlier this year. The four-story home at 36 Craven Street was Franklin's residence for 16 years, and it was here that he entertained the likes of Adam Smith, Joseph Priestley, and Thomas Paine.

Saturday morning we get back to the 250th anniversaries with a retrospective look at the critical 1756 raid on Kittanning that was led by Col. John Armstrong. Jeff Wood is an historian from Carlisle who is Vice-President of the Cumberland County Historical Society and editor of Cumberland County History, the journal of the Society. He is best known to many seminar participants as the owner of The Whistlestop Bookshop. His talk is entitled: "The War on Terror, 1756: Armstrong's Raid on Kittanning."

Immediately following Jeff's presentation, and prior to the first break, Paladin Communications will offer a tantalizing few minutes of the recently completed feature documentary, *Pursuit of Honor: The Rise of George Washington*.

Speaker two on Saturday is one of the featured historians appearing in *Pursuit of Honor*. Patricia Brady of New Orleans is a lecturer, author, and expert on the Washington Family, particularly Eleanor Parke Custis, Martha Washington's granddaughter. Dr. Brady is author of the recent bestseller, *Martha Washington: An American Life* (Viking, 2005), which Publishers Weekly described as "a richly woven tapestry of social history and biography."

Following lunch, the BRPA will ask attendees to vote on officers nominated to serve on the board of directors in 2007. Then the presentations resume with BRPA board member Joan Mancuso, who has spent the past few years documenting all major F&I 250 events with her camera. Joan will present a series of remarkable slides that looks back at these unique commemorations. Some of these images can be seen on the 2007 BRPA Braddock's Road photo calendar, which will be available for sale at the seminar.


Joan will be followed by David Armour, former Deputy Director of the Mackinac Island Park System, who will discuss his long association with Fort Michilimackinac. Dr. Armour has written several books on the subject. He also instituted the fort's living history program, and led restoration efforts to recreate the French village and outpost that later, in British hands, was the site of a notorious attack during Pontiac's Rebellion.

passionate redhead with an explosive temper—a man of incredible drive and ambition.

Shot over 18 months, produced in cooperation with George Washington's Mount Vernon Estate & Gardens, Colonial Williamsburg, Alexandria's historic Carlyle House, and several other historic sites, and backed by the foundation community, *Pursuit of Honor* used hundreds of reenactors and dozens of consulting historians to depict the real George Washington and his experiences—including a vivid recreation of Braddock's Defeat.

Some familiar names and faces helped Paladin tell Washington's story. They include Fred Anderson (Crucible of War and Dominion of War), Stephen Brumwell (Redcoats and White Devil), and Bruce Egli (one of BRPA's founders). Newcomers include Peter Henriques (the recent Realistic Visionary), Patricia Brady (Martha Washington: An American Life), Dennis Pogue (associate director of Mount Vernon), and James Cameron (living historian and owner of Revolutionary Tours in Williamsburg).

Next up for Paladin is a site film for Jumonville, recounting the history of this unique piece of ground—in the French & Indian War and beyond.

What's Ahead for the BRPA

November is always a big month for Pennsylvania's largest French & Indian War seminar, and if we look ahead to 2008, the Braddock Road Preservation Association anticipates another landmark event: the Forbes Conference held in partnership with the Fort Ligonier Foundation. This event will commemorate the capture of Fort Duquesne (a November event) and founding of Pittsburgh.

Tentative plans also call for events to take place at both Jumonville and the British Loyalhanna Camp at Fort Ligonier, which served as the staging ground for attacks on Fort Duquesne—and received an attack by French forces one month before the Forks fell to Gen. John Forbes, Col. Henry Bouquet, and Col. George Washington.

Stay tuned for updates about this important 2008 event. It's just one of many BRPA activities as our organization helps Americans understand this rich French & Indian heritage. There's no question—America began here in Southwestern Pennsylvania. We welcome your help to make our seminars a rousing success. Paladin's 'Pursuit of Honor' Ready for Release

In the year 2000, several BRPA founding members appeared in When the Forest Ran Red: Washington, Braddock & a Doomed Army, which had its sneak preview at the 12th annual BRPA seminar. Since that time, Jumonville has continued to serve as an important partner in the work of Paladin Communications. That partnership now includes the release of Pursuit of Honor: the Rise of George Washington, for which Jumonville and BRPA served as a conduit for grants awarded by Pennsylvania foundations—grants significant enough to allow completion of the motion picture.

With *Pursuit of Honor*, Paladin Communications sifted through 26 volumes of Washington's own writings, involved the nation's leading scholars, and traced Washington's footsteps, following the trail of America's most elusive founding father. The result is the first non-broadcast, independent motion picture ever attempted to cover such an ambitious and unknown topic. The Washington that emerges is not born of legend and broadcast television—a white-haired man with a square jaw and an imperious nature. He is a strapping, young,




Braddock Road Signage Project Update
